The Bioethics subcommittee has been more active in the background than its activities show. Although the idea of a series of bioethics talks by Fr Lucas Chan SJ was explored, it was not possible to find a time slot to make that possible. The Bioethics subcommittee has also been involved in finding experts to address the questions of the human papillomavirus vaccine and transsexuals in response to questions from the Diocese and from religious groups. In April a talk on NaPro technology and the Creighton Model System was given by Fr Joseph Tham LC, and the interest generated led to the adoption of the topic for today's Symposium and plans to promote NaPro amongst the membership and perhaps to introduce this into the SAR in the next few years.

The academic year 2012-23 has been a fruitful year and much of what we did was met with encouraging success. The following is an account of our endeavours to maintain and nourish the catholic faith of our medical students throughout this year.

We have been enthusiastic in taking part in activities that were made available to us by the Catholic Society of the CUHK and the Guild of St. Luke, as well as organising regular activities such as monthly cell group gatherings.

The year started with the annual orientation medical cell group gathering which quite a number of CUHK medical alumni and students joined. Like past years it succeeded in attracting catholic students, especially new students of both medical years 0 and 1. Apart from discussions on spirituality, medical students across different classes had this chance to get to know each other so that they were made aware that support, both spiritual and academic, is always readily available should they need it. Our participation in the Mass for the new academic year in September held by the Hong Kong Federation of Catholic Societies was an opportunity for our medical students and non-medical students to join in prayer for a prosperous year under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Our medical cell gatherings did not always have a high turn-out; despite this apparent difficulty due to vast differences in timetables between the clinical and preclinical curricula we were able to probe deeply into various issues such as theology of the body and some Church history. Recently we had a greater emphasis on the Scripture and were able to reflect thoroughly on our spiritual lives through in-depth discussions, for example, how Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman relates to the Sacrament of Confession, and how the book of Exodus chronicled the ancient history of the Sacrament of Baptism. Prayers for each other were said at the end of each cell gathering so that our participants were not only spiritually enhanced but also are now well on track to becoming catholic medical students for and with others. In March we prayed for the conclave which elected Pope Francis who replaced Pope Benedict XVI after his abdication in February.

Other events included Christmas carolling at the Prince of Wales Hospital which saw many participants both medical and non-medical, Medical Sunday Mass organised by the Guild, and several talks organised by the CUHK Catholic Society one of which invited catholic politicians from Hong Kong to share how their religious beliefs served as a source of inspiration for them in politics to uphold traditional values and social justice. Regrettably most medical students were unable to join the SARS memorial Mass as examinations were many during that period.

This year ended with a Mass in May for new medical graduates whom we entrusted in God so that they may be inspired to carry out His works. Career advice was also given after the Mass.

In the future we hope to put even more focus on the Scripture, Catholic traditions and church history as we believe that these will be huge divine inspiration for us to stay put in

our faith and never to veer away from it in such times as these where the world is facing a storm of rapid secularisation. We also wish to extend our skills and faith to the community by engaging more in community service and we are constantly in search of such opportunities to sing God's praise so that not only believers will see His glory and mercy, but also those who are blind to our religious faith.
